

Message from a Supernumerary

Dear Circuit friends,

Just because I'm based at Chalkwell Park, it doesn't mean that I meet only people who worship there. Over the years I have been here, I have been happy to get know many folk around the area. I enjoy seeing and talking with fellow Methodists from around our fifteen churches whenever we get together for worship, meetings, for business or pleasure, and have felt the same in other circuits where I have lived.

We are so fortunate in Methodism that we have a wider fellowship with people, who worship in different places, rural chapels, 'city' churches and everything in between – and that's in just one circuit! I value the collegueship of circuit ministers as we meet regularly; none of us is alone in this part of God's church. Methodism in Rochford

Rochford Methodist Church – 200th Anniversary

Wow what a weekend!

On May 28th /29th Rochford celebrated 200 years of Methodism in the town. From humble beginnings in a small property in the corner of the Market Square, the society moved round the corner to premises in North Street and finally, in 1880, to the present church at No 77.

Over the weekend the church was open and hosted the Rochford District Heritage Tapestry. On Saturday afternoon two key members of the team who were responsible for its creation and production told us its story. This had been stitched by many members of the community stretching over all the parishes that form Rochford District. Originally it was due to be displayed in 2020 to celebrate 1,000 years since the battle of Assandun in 1016. It was finished in time, but due to Covid, it has only recently begun to be shown around the local area. It is well worth going to see.

Anne Briant, from Shoebury Methodist Church also put work on display with a wonderful selection of modern artwork depicting life's journeys and challenges.

We found various pieces of memorabilia that were tucked away in various cupboards and lofts etc. There was a Circuit plan from 1851, when we were part of the Maldon Circuit and even some pieces of very ancient crockery similar in design to one produced in the late 1800s and early-1900s. This was used here by worshippers picnicking in the Vestry, who could then have attended afternoon and evening services without having to walk home in between. This may have been a considerable distance and more time-consuming than the buses and cars we use today. Photograph albums from our building's Centenary in 1980 were pored over with much amusement.

A second talk in the afternoon was about our own church history and notable people who had been related to us in many ways through the years.

Rev Calvin and Pastor Steve led an afternoon service on Sunday attended by representatives from Churches across the Circuit. It is many years since our church was so full of Methodists and the singing truly raised the roof. Despite poor health Rev Teresa Rutterford had made us a beautiful new wall hanging which was unveiled and dedicated during the service.

Afternoon tea followed. One of our members had baked a birthday cake topped with sparklers and Rev Calvin cut it as we sang Happy Birthday. Everyone went home full of sandwiches and cakes.

During the rest of this year, we will be welcoming back several of our more recent ministers to preach and are looking forward to many more years of a Methodist presence here in Rochford.





JUBILEE CELEBRATIONS

Our Service was very well supported by the local community with many people dressed wearing a combination of red, white and blue! We enjoyed singing a range of hymns including some of the Queen's favourites and concluded the service by signing a medley of patriotic songs such as Rule Britannia and Land of Hope and Glory.

A fantastic puppet show was put on for the children (and children at heart) which was the highlight of the day – the children who visit the Project now want their own puppets for Christmas!

After this, everyone moved onto the field opposite the church for a sports day involving tug of war and races. It is the first time in two years the neighbourhood has come together in fellowship, and you can see a church-community being birthed.
