Message from a Pastor

Dear Circuit friends,

First Hundred Days at Rochford Methodist Church

I joined Rochford Methodist Church in Sep 2023 as a Community Outreach Pastor and I have enjoyed the start of my role at the Church. The members are friendly and welcoming and always keen to try out new ideas and initiatives. In talking through what I hoped to be able to get involved in, nothing seemed to be excluded. The congregation are very servant-hearted, always willing to get involved and to help others.

Although small, Church members run a lot of community activities and have developed strong links into the local community. The church is a praying church; they faithfully turn to prayer on a frequent basis. The weekly zoom prayer meetings work well, being accessible to all and a good length to enable things to be prayed about without becoming an overly-long meeting.

The group that the church has struggled to engage with are slightly older children and families and my role has been to try and reach out to them. This has developed into an outreach plan of overlapping circles.

The first has been to target with the wider community. This has primarily taken the shape of leading assembles at our local Primary School on a regular basis, which has given an opportunity to share the Christian Faith with a large number of pupils while also being able to gain a level of awareness of what I am doing in the area and I hope some credibility as well. I have also been able to advertise events that we are running. My approach with the school was to offer them a service as schools normally ask busy teachers to run assemblies and if I can take away one part of the work then that will be welcomed. I have tried to keep assemblies light and fun, for example singing 'Baby Shark' while talking about Jonah and carrying out pass the parcel with parts of the nativity story in it during advent.

The next circle has been to put on more targeted events. These have taken the form of a light party and Christmas craft club. They have had a hook, in terms of free craft, free pumpkins to carve and also for the light party free dinner. As a family, you are looking for an event where you can enjoy time with your children, at a time that works for the family and is a blessing in terms of helping with practical details like eating. The light party ran from 4.00pm - 6.00pm and sought to tick these boxes. We had 19 Adults join us with 21 children.

The risk was in a low turnout, however with a range of publicity, hooks and prayer this was overcome. Families attending did indeed come from both local schools. Those attending were asked what future events they would like to attend, and the response was a mixture of afterschool clubs and events at the weekend.

I am hoping to run a larger event every 6-8 weeks, looking to run approximately every half-term. These events have a lead in time of at least four weeks and are reliant on volunteers. They would also all need a hook of some sort. Although not called messy church, they follow the pattern of craft / games / talk / food that is used in messy church. The craft event was smaller in scale, but still attracted five families along. I am looking to start a lego club in the new year. Events need to be regular enough to build a group of attending families, but perhaps not weekly to avoid burn out of volunteers!

The final circle is that of events in the church, either kids church, Church itself or an outreach course. We have had a couple of families now join us at kids church from the other activities, which has been encouraging. Yet the end goal is not to increase church attendance, it is to share the good news. The previous events are all designed to bring people to a place where they have a greater opportunity to hear the gospel message. While encouraging, it does pose the question can other activities like messy church be made available as well? Could these be run on a monthly basis at the weekend? How would these link with the bigger events? Or can a specific games night / families event be run on a monthly basis? It is also key that we are to keep seeking the salvation of people central to our work, rather than just getting numbers along to our community events, but the starting point is to run creative, fun and good quality events that will draw people in to begin with!

Although the role of the church team at events is mainly to serve, if the church is to be intergenerational, then we also need to allow friendships to develop over the generations and I hope that these events will help to continue that process.

Salvation Army Stuff on the Bus Project Castle Point Area

The Salvation Army have launched Stuff on a Bus on Canvey Island in October for the Castle Point Area, a new mobile community supermarket where customers can get discounted food from a refurbished double-decker bus.

The Salvation Army is working in partnership with Essex County Council and Feeding Britain by jointly funding this initiative which aims to bring some relief to local people who are struggling. This is in response to the cost-of-living crises.

The supermarket will be on the bottom deck of the bus while the top deck will have facilities including a mobile banking unit, an Employment Plus area, access to job-advice and a wellbeing coach. Customers have the opportunity to buy items at a reduced price after paying a £5 annual sign-on-fee.

The new Stuff on a Bus service will initially run for two days a week. On Tuesdays, it will make two stops at Link Road from 10am to 12pm and The Paddocks from 2pm to 4pm, while on Fridays it will stop outside St Nicholas Church from 10am to 11am, the Small Gains Hall from 11.30am to 12.30pm and Canvey Island FC from 2pm to 3pm. A personal shopper service will be offered for disabled customers.






WESTERLEY CYCLE RIDE

GREENBELT 2023

At the Communion Service on the morning of Sunday 27th August, I asked Lazarus, a refugee who has officially received asylum in this country, what he has enjoyed most during the weekend. His reply gave me joy and sadness. He simply said, 'the kindness of the people' not an event, not a speaker, not a performer but 'the kindness of the people.' This meant the kindness of about fifteen thousand people in one community for three to four days. That really does sum up **GREENBELT**. Here people try to accommodate others by listening, encouraging, and laughing, they debate issues not people and try to come up with solutions. The sadness came as I realized possibly it was the only place, he felt welcome and safe.

So, in short, what did I do at **GREENBELT** this year – well Friday turned out to be a political day. It began with John Bell from the Iona Community explaining that the image of Jesus as 'gentle, meek and mild' does Him a disservice. For three years of his Life Jesus challenged the authorities, the communities, and his own disciples. In this age then we should challenge those around us to care for others. Pondering this I felt the need to go to one of my favourite places, The Tiny Tea Tent for tea and a flapjack, where I saw 'the kindness of the people.'

Gordon Brown, former prime minister, was next – packed out tent to listen to him, on challenging the government on poverty in this country. Amazing speaker – no notes humourous illustrations but hard-hitting facts too. The one that seems to have stayed in my brain was there over FOUR HUNDRED THOUSAND FAMILIES without the means to cook. He was arguing that poverty is a moral issue, and he lives in HOPE of all peoples, charities and political parties creating a coalition to end poverty in the UK. His first act would be to begin a comprehensive review of Universal Credit. Next was Tim Farron MP Liberal Democrat passionately speaking about why he is still in politics especially at constituency level. I was so encouraged that I then went to the Christian Aid Tent and completed a letter to Anna Firth about the lack of funds for the poor in this country.

Saturday was really all about worship Christian Aid morning prayer – peaceful and challenging, then a wander to the prayer space for quiet prayer. Followed by a noisy, happy, joyous hour with FISCHY MUSIC. Here I can be a child again, joining in the songs, getting the actions wrong but thoroughly enjoying myself towards the back of the tent trying not to be too obvious. Unfortunately, I forgotten I had my where's Wally red and white striped T shirt on! So, if you watch Songs of Praise with Kate Botley on Sunday 17th September you may or may not spot me but here, I witnessed the 'the kindness of the people.' Then to a talk by John Bell near the TINY TEA TENT – all good but left quickly for a Catholic mass at the other end of the festival ground. A roast pork burger for my evening meal and listening to the Gospel group – The Spirituals in the worship tent. Slept well at the hotel.

Sunday up early to secure a spot to be able to see the main stage and gather all our friends about eighteen of us this year, along with the other fifteen thousand to listen to a service prepared by FISCHY MUSIC and David and Carrie Grant with the theme of Thanks, Sharing and Giving with a HI-5 of Peace:

God makes peace within us. Let's claim it. God makes peace between us. Let's share it.

Afterwards an Iona talk, about doing worship well and being part of worship. Lastly but not least our own Fisherman's Chapel choir leading gospel songs in the worship tent. A joyous event/worship showing 'the kindness of the people.' Won't you join us next year?

The Light / Projection show delighted the crowd in attendance, and made the Church shine out across the whole estate – displaying the Light of Christ for the whole community.




