### Music Chaplaincy

#### Dear Circuit friends,

When I candidated for ministry in the Methodist Church, one of the roles I felt a strong call to was pastorally and spiritually caring for musicians as a community. Many of you will know I have been a professional musician for over 20 years making my living solely from singing jazz, playing double bass, being a vocal coach and helping to run two choirs. I have sung all over this country and abroad but now I tend to sing closer to home in Southend and London.

I am a part-time locally-deployed presbyter minister with pastoral care of Highlands Methodist Church, The Fishermen's Chapel and Music Chaplaincy. I entered ministry as part-time because I still felt being a musician was part of my calling while I am able.

I know the musician community very well; they are a community without walls. They are people with constant financial struggles with no permanent income and they often have family struggles working away from home and travelling. Their work stopped over night during the pandemic. They are generally spiritual people with a longing for connection and truth in their work and they are wonderful evangelists of God's gifts - sharing them with so many. They too, like other communities, have births, deaths, marriages, divorces, mental health and physical health problems.

Much like hospital, school, army chaplains, musicians too need someone to walk with them. I felt God calling me to care for this group of people.

The Methodist Church is growing in new ways as we consider what church might look like in the future. They were excited to hear about my calling and agreed to support me.







These are the kinds of things I get involved in:

- I have visited many concerts in our city in my clerical collar, handing out leaflets about Chaplaincy and my personal cards. I have spoken with musicians about the support I am there for. Chaplaincy is for all faiths and none, so conversations can simply be about how life is going or I can get into conversations about faith.
- I have also written an article for the Musicians Union magazine and blog which goes out worldwide. I have received emails and phone calls from musicians all over the country and America. (Music Chaplaincy: Getting Support for Musicians Through a Faith Organisation | The MU)
- I have taken two funerals of musicians in the city.
- Spoken regularly with a very well-known musician in the jazz field who after struggling with drugs and having no faith, they have turned their life around and they are now promoting their belief in God.
- I have walked with musicians in need of support and done hospital visits and supported families.

My probation period for Ministry has had lots of extra demands so there is much more work I could be involved in that I presently don't have time for in my chaplaincy role. These are some of the areas I would like to develop:

- Engaging with other chaplains and growing Music Chaplaincy across the country.
- I have been involved with a company who have choirs sing at The Tower of London, they are working with lots of musicians to have choirs in other big London Venues. I am interested in providing Methodist Chaplaincy for their events.
- I could offer more as a chaplain and music advisor in the Circuit.
- I would like to go to more events and have time to follow up with the musicians I have given cards out to.
- I would like to offer services for musicians with Holy Communion that is focussed on their needs. Like the service in New York which was set up by Dizzy Gillespie. It involved the service being in the afternoon midweek, jazz hymns, healing, raising money for health care of other musicians and faith healing.
- I would like to contact venues/churches speaking of the justice issues of paying musicians the Musicians Union rate for their work and changing the culture of assuming musicians will play for free or little money because they enjoy it! They have mortgages to pay like everyone else and you wouldn't expect a plumber to come out for free, so why a highly trained musician.

### Getting Contemplative and Hushing the Noise at Highlands Methodist Church

Among new offerings to complement our mainstay services and activities at Highlands in recent months, we've been keen to explore a variety of contemplative practices as a way of deepening our relationship with God. These include several practices that stem from medieval times and earlier which have become popular during recent years, such as *lectio divina*, labyrinth walking and lovingkindness meditation.

Our wanderings into such activities have so far been limited to odd offerings, such as a series of weekly *lectio* contemplations during advent, which we offered both within the church and online using the lectionary readings the church was following on the theme *Hush the Noise*. We also enjoyed welcoming a canvas labyrinth into the church on a couple of occasions, and engaged in a 'Highlands Pilgrimage' – a mindful walk of discovery around our neighbourhood last year, in which we sought to be open to being present, praying for our community, and noticing the beauty and wonder that's right under our noses.

For those who may not be familiar with the idea, contemplative practice aims to be focused on being in the here and now, or fully present. It recognises that God really is everywhere, in everything and in every moment, not distant from us. As the ecumenical teacher Richard Rohr puts it, contemplation is about entering into a deeper silence and letting go of our habitual thoughts, sensations, and feelings in order to connect to God. The emphasis is on having a direct, personal experience of God, and in silence, hearing the deep and sometimes hidden meaning of His Word. Being fully present and open to God's presence, inspiration and guidance, and being able to really tune into the heart, are key to this. Unsurprisingly, such practices were very popular with monks, nuns and mystics of old.

Among practices that might help cultivate contemplation are *centered prayer* (it has the American spelling, as that's where the practice was popularised), various forms of meditation, *lectio divina*, silent communion (an entire service conducted in silence), labyrinth walking, and walking meditation. Closely aligned are practices such as body prayer, dance and chanting (e.g. Taizé), which help embody our connection with God and each other – in the case of chanting, quite literally, resonating with a common heart.

*Centered prayer* involves silent, very attentive, heart-felt prayer, that involves first becoming anchored in the heart through meditation, usually by focusing on a repeated saying or characteristic of Jesus (e.g. "peace"). We've yet to explore this, but likely have a good opportunity to do so in our house group.

Lectio divina originated in the early centuries of the Christian Church and became especially popular during the Middle Ages. It has enjoyed a resurgence in many denominations in recent years. There are a number of variations on the practice, but it essentially involves hearing a reading from scripture several times, allowing silence in between each reading for contemplation. To hear scripture several times was especially important for the many monks in medieval times who were illiterate. But we found how powerful it is to not only have time to tune in with the full context of a passage, but to be drawn to a particular teaching, words or an image that speaks to us in the moment. Given last year's advent theme of *Hush the Noise*, the opportunity to enjoy shared silence as we contemplated the various scripture passages guided by the lectionary was especially meaningful. Our online offering even attracted folks from outside our local community from various places across North America.

Labyrinths – each having a single, curving path that leads to a centre – have existed in many cultures throughout recorded history. Walking one simply involves following the path while holding open a question, point for reflection, or prayer. Most who do so describe the experience as feeling surprisingly beautiful, inspiring and pointed. Being non-denominational, labyrinths are very inclusive, often appealing to people who do not claim a faith, as well as being much loved by believers. Many churches and cathedrals have labyrinths built into their sanctuaries or outside. Chislehurst Methodist Church is one such church in the UK that has a permanent indoor labyrinth – not to mention the beautiful labyrinth table that rests by the altar in The Fishermen's Chapel!

However, portable labyrinths, usually painted on a canvas that can be folded and packed away for easy storing or transportation, are also popular. It's one such labyrinth, based on the design of a famous labyrinth at Chartres Cathedral in France, that we've been able to occasionally borrow to lay out at Highlands. This we did last 'World Labyrinth Day,' when people from all faith traditions and none around the world are invited to 'walk as one at one' (walk a labyrinth at 1pm in their time zone) while offering prayers for peace. We are hoping to offer another walk before long.

Many who've enjoyed the activities hosted at Highlands said how uplifting and inspired they felt by them, and we're looking forward to further offerings in the same vein very soon. We'll let you know, and of course, would love anyone who wishes to join us to be a part of these!


The Spoken Words of Jesus


